JDF volunteers dropped off bags of shoes and clothes to help make life a bit sweeter for the residents.


Prince William County, Virginia, is

considered a relatively affluent county, yet 'Tent Cities' have developed in some of their wooded areas. The tents are visible to commuters as they zoom up and down Interstate 95 each day. Men and women move into the woods and live in tents. They brave the cold temperatures in the winter and the oppressive heat in the summer. Some of the people who live in the woods have jobs and others are looking for jobs. Others are down on the luck and have no place else to go. All face desperate times and a difficult economy. These ingredients have created unlikely bonds of friendship.
