The number of homeless veterans is declining. There are less than **40,000 homeless** who have been identified as veterans. This decrease is due in large part to partnership efforts between organizations.

The JDF partnered with our new friends at the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 341 and internationally recognized architecture and interior design firm, BBGM. BBGM Director Alfred H. Gooden, III wanted to gift veterans with backpacks this Christmas. Each backpack BBGM delivered to the VFW had socks, a shirt and a hat, along with a blanket, ready for delivery to a homeless vet. The VFW enlisted help from The JDF and we will 'bonus pack' the backpacks. We will provide shoes, socks, toe warmers, toenail clippers and foot care supplies to the vets. Thank you to BBGM and Director Alfred H. Gooden, III for their generosity. We also thank VFW Post 341 Commander Allen White, Past Dept. Commander John Johnson and Dept. Quarter Master 'Snapper' Danzy for partnering with us. This Christmas will be a little warmer for some of the vets who sacrificed so much in service to our country.
