Frequently parents bring their kids into their activities. Artavia began volunteering to collect shoes with our JDF team and her daughter immediately joined her efforts. Their volunteer work has already improved the lives of dozens of families. We delivered goods to our neighbors in NE Washington, DC just in time for them to prepare for the new school year. If we can relieve their suffering with a new or gently used pair of Nike's, that's exactly what we want do. Anyone can wear clothing that doesn't fit too well, but no one can wear a pair of shoes that don't fit well, for too long.

Fortunately for us, Artavia and Dayonna were ahead of the curve. They collected the first new and gently used Nikes we received, and the shoes are still coming in!
